

## Notice of Public Hearing Concerning Application

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on Thursday, May 28, 2020 at 6:00 pm the ***Town of Stuckey, Williamsburg County***, and Waccamaw Regional Council of Governments *will host a joint teleconference Public Hearing* concerning an application to be submitted to South Carolina Department of Commerce, Grants Administration on or about June 15, 2020, for a Community Development Block Grant. The toll free call in number is ***844-219-5838-Conference Code 6673824691***. The Town of Stuckey is requesting \$286,413 to carry out the following activities.

- The Town of Stuckey will be providing potable drinking water to approximately 42 houses in the Henrytown Community. An added benefit to this project will be the installation of fire hydrants for fire protection, which is currently unavailable. The project will consist of connecting to an existing water system and installing meters and connecting the Henrytown residences to the new water lines and disconnecting from their existing wells.

This public hearing and the matters to be discussed are subject to the provisions of the ***Town of Stuckey*** Citizen Participation Plan, developed in anticipation of participation in the State of South Carolina's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, providing for the participation of the citizens of the ***Town of Stuckey*** in the planning and implementation of community and economic development projects which will involve CDBG funds. The Citizen Participation Plan is available for review at Stuckey Town Hall from 9am-5pm.
