The Town of Kingstree is requesting \$750,000.00 to carry out the following activities.

- The proposed Upper Kingstree Branch drainage improvements will replace existing 48” storm drain pipe with 60” storm drain pipes and replace existing 60” storm drain pipes with 72” storm drain pipes. The upgrade in pipe size will allow for greater and more efficient flow of stormwater through the pipes which will greatly reduce the risk of flooding from rainstorms thereby increasing the safety of residents of the Upper Kingstree Branch area and their homes/property. Other sections of the Upper Kingstree Branch will undergo widening by clearing vegetative debris to increase the flow conveyance capability of the open channel.

This public hearing and the matters to be discussed are subject to the provisions of the Town Kingstree Citizen Participation Plan, developed in anticipation of participation in the State of South Carolina's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, providing for the participation of the citizens of the Town of Kingstree in the planning and implementation of community and economic development projects which will involve CDBG funds.
